CEO's Corner



Hello Supporters & Friends:

We have moved, and I think you'll be moved to see the dramatic scale of our growth.

Here's the "Before & After" of our relocation.

BEFORE: Great location in Palm Springs. (Tickled to think that a Florida town shares the name with California's tony desert destination.) On a well-traveled thoroughfare and bus route, and not too far from I95. We were tucked into the second floor of a small office building that adequately answered our needs back in 2019, with some offices easily converted into "shoe room," "jewelry & accessories room", etc. It wasn't long into our 6-year stay that the elevator began having breakdowns, and Thursday donation days were especially treacherous when volunteers had to schlepp the clothing racks and accessories loads upstairs. Yours truly was scarily stuck on a few occasions. It became a concern.

AFTER: Improved location in Greenacres. (Tickled that it reminds me of the '60s comedy show of the same name starring Eddie Albert and Eva Gabor as NYC transplants to farm country.) Now we're at a PB County east-west/north-south crossroad, Forest Hill Boulevard and Jog Road. Highly accessible via two bus routes (a bus stop is right outside our door) and in a bustling shopping plaza where you'll find a UPS Store, Ross, Ace Hardware, fiveBELOW, Crunch Fitness, and Publix (our new landlord). Free standing businesses on the property include several banks: Chase, Truist, and Wells Fargo. And, we're surrounded by a ton of restaurants: Duffy's, Applebee's, iHop, KFC, Pizza Hut, Chipotle, Chick-fil-A, Pete's Place and Bowled – something for everyone! What's particularly exciting is that our Dress for Success brand has exposure in a high-traffic area. It will stimulate interest and curiosity and build greater awareness about who we are and what we do. And we expect that will lead to more participants in our programs and women who we can help.

BEFORE: A ready-made conference room comfortably accommodated about 24, and this was a huge selling point in leasing the space. It enabled us to bring our job readiness training sessions and Board meetings in-house versus having to go off-site.

Over time, though, we outgrew it, with participants in Road to Success, PWG and Volunteer Events spilling out into the reception area because we were so squeezed for space.

AFTER: With a gut renovation of the new space, we were able to double the capacity of the Training Room. We consider this space our jewel in the crown. And, we're extraordinarily fortunate that a nearby residential community, The Pointe at Palm Beach Grove, donated all the furnishings which formerly were in their WeWork-like clubhouse.

I could go on and on – because the 6,032 square-foot space certainly does. We have 6 dressing rooms worthy of a high-end boutique; a jewelry and accessories corner that's absolutely dazzling with display furnishings donated by Saks Fifth Avenue from their former Worth Avenue store; 4 cheery restrooms all ADA compliant; a kitchen-break-respite room for volunteers; a private room for individual coaching sessions; 4 private workspace offices for staff. And thanks to back-door drop-off access and parking at the rear of the plaza, we've set up there to accept, sort and process clothing donations and then store whatever merchandise will be featured in our occasional "Shop for Success" Pop-Up Sales. It's an entirely separate operation from the boutique and client services.

We are deeply grateful to those who so generously made all of this possible. The Frederick A. DeLuca Foundation helped get the ball rolling with a \$125,000 grant. And among others who stepped up are Karen & Ray Masciarella and the W Bradford Ingalls Foundation; The Neil S. Hirsch Foundation; Lost Tree Foundation; The Quinn Family Foundation; plus individual donors including Ellen Gorringe; JoAnne Greiser; Dee & Tommy Hilfiger; and Susan Levine. Finally, a round of applause and thanks for a hard- working crew of dedicated volunteers who helped to design and set up our impressive new digs.

I invite you to come see for yourself. I do think you'll be moved by it all.

"I will be eternally grateful for the Dress for Success Road to Success Program! My journey began with knowing I needed to get better, overcome depression, and find a job. I knew I would need clothes ... had heard of Dress for Success for decades then saw the Road to Success program on the website. I didn't really know what to expect, signed up, and It ended up being the best decision I have made for myself in a very long time! One of the first statements in the program that resonated with me: If I do the work and invest in myself for the next five weeks, my life could change.

Before the program even officially started, I had a Zoom meeting with volunteer Tirzah [Gabourel] who taught me about ChatGPT. By taking the time to explain this new AI world to me, it profoundly helped me research and find a future career for myself.

Shirelle [Francis], who volunteered her time to help me with my resume and interview questions, recommended I apply at Rayus Radiology. That was life-changing; I started my job there in IV Therapy on September 9.

There also were a few helpful guest speakers over the weeks, such as a banking expert who helped me open a secured credit card that I will now use to just pay my cell phone bill each month and build my credit again. The Clinique speaker suggested a skin care routine two times a day that I've been following. I also loved the Professional Makeup & Photography session we were treated to. At 50 years old, I had never had my makeup done before. It made me feel special, important and pretty... some things I have not felt for a very long time.

From the very first day, program facilitator Dr. Nethel Stephens, with raw honesty, shared her own life journey. It made me feel not so alone and not like such a loser. Her real talk and speeches empowered me.

And lastly but not least, I would love to thank my mentor, Rhonda!!! Her constant and continuous encouragement meant and means the world to me!"

Our Professional Women's Group put the doubled capacity of our new Training Center to the test with 34 participants filling the room, fully engrossed in the September 13th session on A.I. presented by tech whiz Tirzah Gabourel. A familiar tech coach to many of the women who had graduated Road to Success, Tirzah delivered a dynamic session on Artificial Intelligence, showing real-time demonstrations of how A.I. can be used to research potential employers, strengthen LinkedIn profiles, and polish resumes. Attendees also had some creative fun experimenting with A.I.-generated photos, sparking plenty of laughs and curiosity. Unanimously, the group requested a Part 2 session on the subject, realizing the growing need to adopt usage of A.I. to level up their employment opportunities.
