What's A Tester?

Fair Housing testers are individuals who are trained to portray active home seekers. They visit various housing providers and lending institutions to express their interest in renting, purchasing, or obtaining financing for housing. They complete detailed reports on their experience for the Fair Housing Project at the Legal Aid Society of Palm Beach County. These reports are then compared to see if they were treated differently based on their identities.

Requirements?

- ~ 18+ Years of Age
- ~ Attend Training
- ~ No Felony Convictions
- ~ Objective, Observant, and Timely

We Need Your Help!

Testing Programs need diversity. We need people of all races, colors, national origins, abilities, ages and genders. Testers are trained and receive a small stipend for each test. Testers should be dependable and be able to complete a post-test report.

Why Should You Be A Tester?

Testers help fight housing discrimination. You will be helping people live where they choose. Your work will help ensure that landlords and property owners follow the law.
