

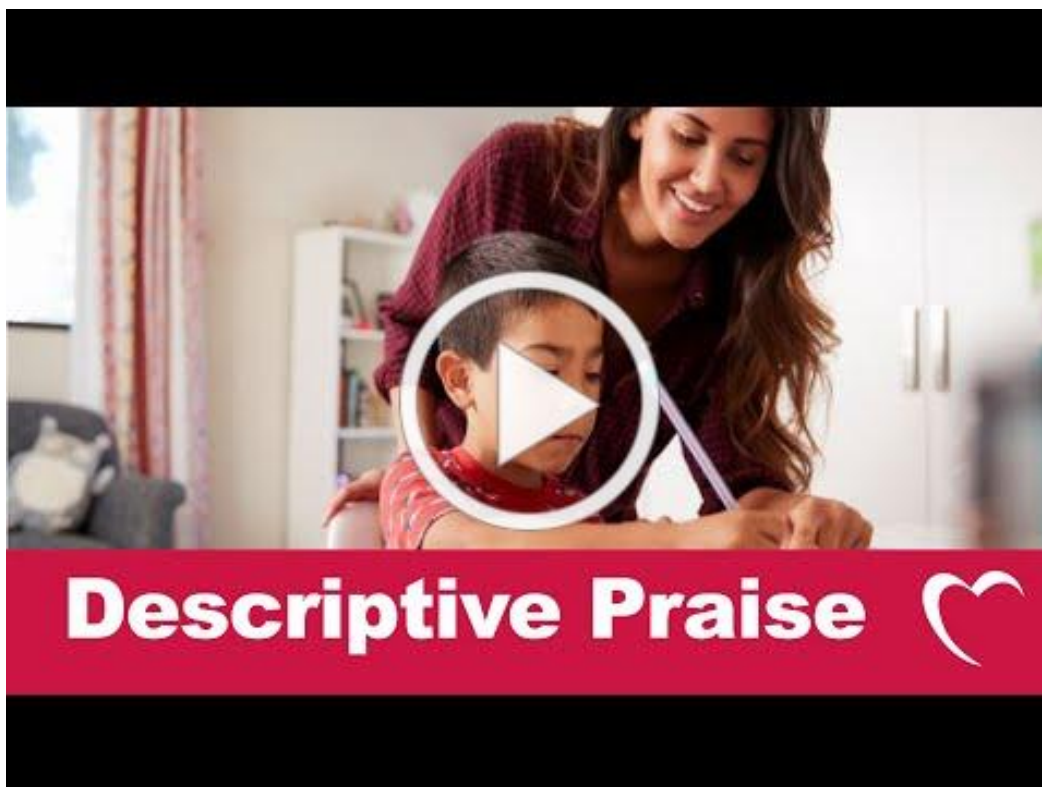
The Power of Descriptive Praise <

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The Power of Descriptive Praise ⚡



Descriptive praise can be a powerful tool for a parent to encourage good behavior. By providing attention to your child when they are behaving, it increases the chances of that behavior happening again.

Descriptive praise means being specific about the good behaviors or actions of your child, says Amelia Baena, a therapist with Triple P (Positive Parenting Program). That means saying things like, "Thank you for picking up your toys" or "Thank you for sharing your toys with your little brother." It's better to be specific than offer just general approval like "Good job."
