AN IMPORTANT REMINDER FOR LWVPBC MEMBERS WHO REGISTER VOTERS

Even though Florida is a closed-primary state, that does **NOT** mean people who register as NPA (no party affiliation) cannot vote in primaries. Many elected positions such as Sheriff, Supervisor of Elections, Property Appraiser, Circuit and County Judges and local officers are not affiliated with a political party. There also may be non-partisan questions on the ballot. Hence, primaries are open to *all* registered voters.

It is incorrect to encourage new voters to choose a political party so they can vote in the primaries. We can and should encourage new voters to choose a party, if they wish, so they may help select that party's nominee for partisan positions, such as governor, senator, and representative.

DID YOU KNOW?

Most of our Legislators have periodic bulletins they send out to constituents and other interested parties. For example, Senator Lori Berman has the "*Berman Buzz*", and Representative Matt Willhite has the "*Willhite Weekly Wrap-Up*". To have them sent to you, contact the legislator's office and ask to be put on their mailing list. They are very happy to do it, and you will stay informed.
