Child abuse deaths are down, but more children need foster families

Of the more than 1,500 children who were abused or neglected in Palm Beach County last year, more than 87 percent were under age 13 and nearly 40 percent were under age 6. In total, six local children died as a result of abuse. To continue to raise awareness and evoke the kind of change that keeps more children safe, Children’s Services Council of Palm Beach County’s board proclaimed April as Child Abuse Prevention Month during its March meeting.
