- > Primary Project is an evidence-based program provided in select elementary schools. Trained staff work with students in child-directed play sessions with the goal of improving school readiness/ adjustment, and enhancing their social/emotional and behavioral well-being.
- > The Boys Town National Hotline® (800-448-3000) is a free resource and counseling service staffed by specially trained Boys Town counselors who help youth and parents 24/7, year round.



As the parent of a toddler, one of the most important things you can do is get your young child ready to start kindergarten.



When children have learned how to work and play with others and can appropriately express themselves in their words and behaviors, they are better prepared to make the transition to school and be successful.

Most importantly, when you play with and read books to your child, and use those experiences as teaching moments, it plants the seeds of a love of learning that will last a lifetime.

A Modeling Approach

In the research-proven **ParentChild+**, you'll learn how to enhance your child's development by working with a trained Early Learning Specialist.

Using specially selected books and educational toys and activities, Early Learning Specialists help parents understand that they are their children's first and most important teacher, and show them how to generate enthusiasm for learning in their children.

Early Learning Specialists role-model for parents how to appropriately use the program materials with children to promote verbal interactions, parent-child bonding and school readiness.

How the Program Works

Families begin the program when their children are between 21 months and 42 months old and complete it as the children turn 4 and transition into prekindergarten or a Head Start program.

An Early Learning Specialist is matched with a family and visits the home for a half hour twice a week on a schedule that is convenient for the family. Whenever possible, the Early Learning Specialist is of the same cultural background as the family, and speaks their primary language.

On the first visit of each week, the Early Learning Specialist brings an educational book or toy that will be used that week. These are a gift to the family, and over time, parents will accumulate a library of books and a collection of stimulating toys they can continue to use with their entire family.

In the home sessions, the Early Learning Specialist models conversation, reading and play activities, demonstrating how parents can use the books and toys to build language and literacy skills and promote school readiness.

Each program year has 23 weeks of home visits and 46 total visits. Research has shown that families benefit the most by spending at least 12 months in the program.

One Child's Success

Before her parents enrolled her in ParentChild+, Marie was extremely shy and did not talk. She was receiving speech therapy, but it didn't seem to be making a difference. One month into the program, Marie started talking and retelling stories she had learned during program sessions. Her parents were so surprised by the tremendous progress she made in such a short time that they went to great lengths to keep session appointments with their Early Learning Specialist and reviewed program materials with their daughter between sessions.

Marie's mother also started using more positive parenting techniques with all her children, which is one of the program's goals as parents learn new behaviors through the Early Learning Specialist's role modeling.

Marie is now outperforming her peers in the Head Start program in which she was recently enrolled, and is a shining example of how **ParentChild+** can positively impact children and their families.
