Community ID of the Palm Beaches

The Community ID of the Palm Beaches is for ANY resident who may have limited access to government issued forms of identification, and for those who support a diverse and inclusive community.

It is not a government issued form of ID or a driver's license, but it is a verifiable form of identification that says you are a part of our community. It can be used within your community to gain access to essential services and as a tool to better identify, serve, and protect you.

Your Community. Your ID.

REQUIRED ITEMS YOU MUST BRING WITH YOU:

- Photo Identification: (current or expired driver's license, national ID card, consular ID or other embassy ID, passport)
- Proof of residency: (utility bill, rental agreement, medical bill, bank statement) dated w/in 3 mo.
- \$20.00 (cash, money order)

Celebrating 50 Sessions of Criminal Justice Education: The Criminal Justice Academy Begins September 17

The Palm Beach County Criminal Justice Commission (CJC), in partnership with the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO), is proud to announce this milestone session of the Citizen's Criminal Justice Academy (CCJA). This *special session* will run from September 17 through December 17, 2025, meeting each Wednesday evening from 6 to 9 p.m., excluding the week of Thanksgiving.

All sessions will be held at PBSO Headquarters, located at 3228 Gun Club Road, West Palm Beach, FL 33406, in the Community Room. Dinner will be served each evening, and participants age 14 and older are welcome to attend.

The CCJA offers a unique, behind-the-scenes look at how Palm Beach County's criminal justice system works. From law enforcement and the courts to corrections and community programs, participants will engage directly with professionals in the field. Whether you are simply curious or a committed skeptic, this course is designed for you.

At the end of the program, participants will receive a Certificate of Completion recognizing their participation and commitment to understanding the criminal justice system.

Area Agency on Aging - Services

Your local Area Agency on Aging, they are committed to supporting independence, dignity, and quality of life. They provide a range of services and supports, including:

- Information and Assistance: Guidance on available programs, services, and community resources.
- Care Coordination: Assessments and care plans tailored to meet individual needs.
- In-Home Services: Personal care, homemaker assistance, and respite care.
- Nutrition Programs: Home-delivered meals and congregate dining.
- Transportation Services: For medical appointments, errands, and other essential trips.
- Caregiver Support: Resources, counseling, and training for family caregivers.
- Health and Wellness Programs: Fall prevention, chronic disease self-management, and other evidence-based workshops.
- Advocacy Services: Including long-term care ombudsman and assistance with benefits and legal support.

Making a Referral

If you know someone who may benefit from their services, referrals are easy to make. Here's how:

1. Call Us: Reach out to their main line at 866-684-5885 and ask to speak with an Intake Specialist.
2. Online Referral: Complete the secure referral form at <https://www.aaapbtc.org/form/contact-us>
3. Fax: Referrals can also be submitted via fax to 561-214-8678.

Once they receive a referral, their team will reach out directly to the individual (or their caregiver) to assess their needs and connect them with appropriate services.

They welcome referrals from healthcare providers, community partners, family members, and individuals themselves. If you have questions about their programs or the referral process, please don't hesitate to contact them directly.

*Do you know **anyone in need of Health Insurance**? If so, call the Covering Florida Navigator Program at the Health Council of Southeast Florida at 561-844-4220. Their licensed Navigators will provide you with **FREE, impartial assistance**. **Special Enrollment Period is now**. You may be able to enroll if you have had certain life events such as losing health coverage, getting married, having a baby, moving, etc. If your income is between 100 % - 150% FPL (1person -\$15,560 - \$23,475) you can also enroll during this time.*

Palm Beach County Food Bank is the sole provider of the federal waiver to provide comprehensive SNAP outreach in Palm Beach County. Palm Beach County Food Bank is one of only four organizations in Florida that holds the waiver for the full interview process required to qualify for SNAP benefits. Palm Beach County Food Bank has access to the state software program to directly add client information as if the state employed them and conducted all face-to-face interviews.

- Medicaid Application
- Cash Assistance
