Description:

The family therapy didactics are a three part series, beginning with Genogram Assessment, followed by Structural Family Therapy and Strategic Family Therapy.

The Genogram presentation will allow for participants to learn the structure of making a Genogram and explore how different family systems are depicted. This intermediate level presentation will explore the clinical implications of Genograms and when they are useful in practice as well as historically how they have been employed.

Learning Objectives:

At the conclusion of the training, participants will be able to:

- 1) Describe the history and background of using genograms in practice through evidence-based sources.
- 2) Identify which situations genograms are useful and important for clinical care.
- 3) Demonstrate the utility of genograms and evaluate how genograms impact clients

in session.
